



#### The Theological Declaration of Barmen (1934)

The Theological Declaration of Barmen was written by a group of church leaders in Germany in 1933-34 to help Christians withstand the challenges of the Mazi party and of the so-called "German Christians", a popular movement that saw no conflict between Christianity and the ideals of Hitler's Mational Socialism. The declaration was debated and adopted without amendment, and the Confessing Church, that part of the church that opposed the German Christians, rallied around it.
