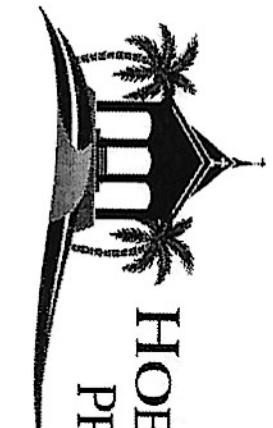

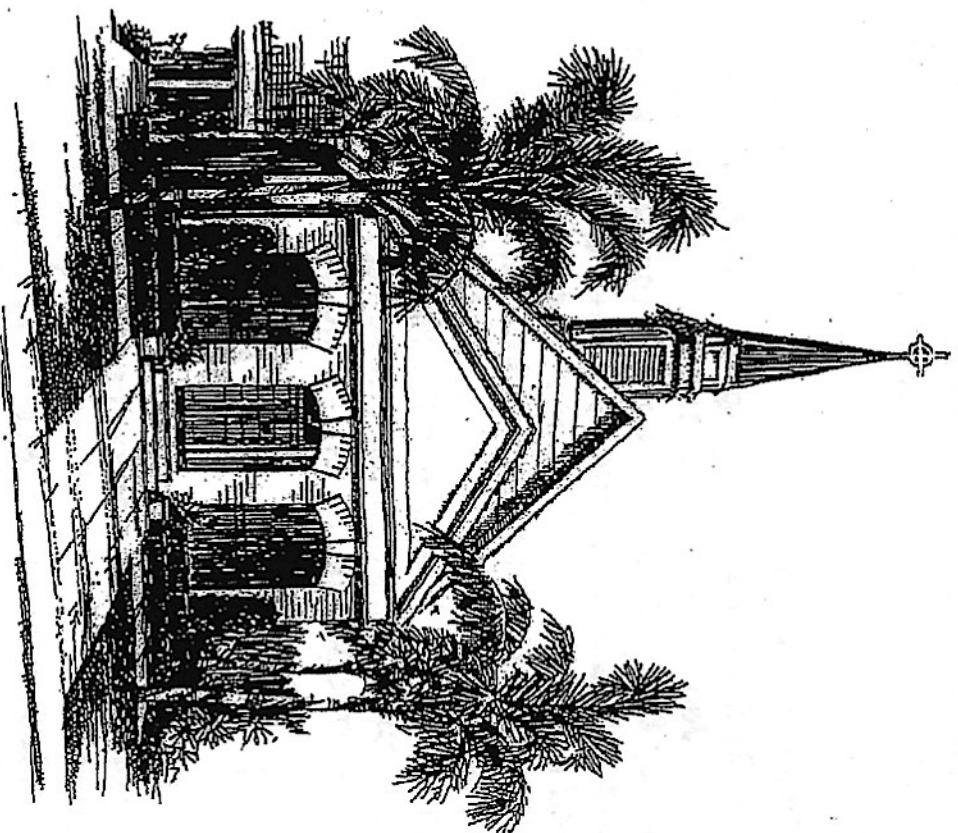

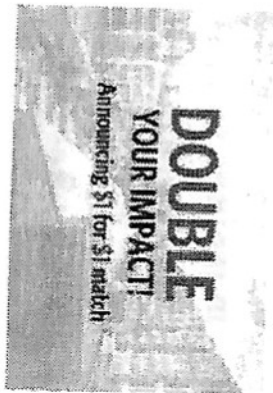

In October an anonymous donor offered a pledge to match up to \$5000 in donations for roof related expenses. In December, another donor offered a pledge to match up to \$10,000 in donations, also for roof related expenses.

Both of these pledges have been met, with a total of \$15,000 in donations plus \$15,000 in matching pledges now deposited in the HSCPC - Memorial & Centennial Fund, For Roof Related Expenses.

ABOUT THE PER CAPITA ASSESSMENT

The first envelope in the Offering Envelopes box is for the **Per Capita Assessment**. It is the only payment to the Presbyterian Church that is required of all active church members.

Per Capita Sunday | A day to celebrate the connectional nature and work of the church, Presbyterians are reminded that Per Capita giving helps to build up and support the Body of Christ

Per Capita consists of funding to the three levels of governance beyond the Session of each congregation - the **Presbytery of Tropical Florida**, the **Synod of the South Atlantic**, and the **General Assembly**.

Each congregation's per capita apportionment assessment for 2025 is based on the membership reported in its Annual Statistical Report for 2024 (as of December 31, 2023). The per capita apportionment for Hobe Sound Community Presbyterian Church is \$2,690.19., based on a reported membership of 71 active members. The per capita apportionment per member is \$37.89. This is divided as follows:
 Presbytery - \$25.55, Synod - \$1.50, General Assembly - \$10.84.

If you are an active member of HSCPC, and have not already done so, please submit this **payment of \$37.89** as soon as possible. If you are unsure of your membership status, please check with Karen Metzger, Clerk of Session.

UPCOMING MISSION PROJECT

IT'S SOUPper BOWL TIME (no, that's not a mis-print)

Again this year, as a special mission project, HSCPC will be participating in the SOUPper Bowl of Caring, by collecting cans / packages of soups and cash donations for the House of Hope.

A simple prayer: "Lord, even as we enjoy the Super Bowl football game, help us be mindful of those who are without a bowl of soup to eat" has inspired a youth-led movement to help hungry and hurting people around the world.

This prayer, delivered in 1990 by Brad Smith, then a seminary intern serving at Spring Valley Presbyterian Church in Columbia, SC, gave birth to an idea. Why not use Super Bowl weekend, a time when people come together for football and fun, to also unify the nation for a higher good: collecting dollars and canned food for the needy? Youth could collect donations at their schools and churches, and then send every soup can and dollar DIRECTLY to a local charity of their choice.

The SOUPper Bowl of Caring has become a powerful movement that is transforming the time around the Big Game into one of the nation's largest celebrations of giving and serving. Young people have been leading the charge and inspiring others to collect dollars and food in the weeks leading up to the Big Game. These groups give 100% of donations to local charities, changing the nation's largest weekend of football into the largest weekend of caring.

Your soup or cash donations should be brought to church on or before Super Bowl Sunday, Feb 9. Soup donations can be left in the church office M thru Th, 9 til noon) if you want to drop them off during the week. Be sure to take advantage of the BOGO's - (Buy One - Get One), and sales.

For cash donations, use the Mission Envelopes found in the pew boxes. Mark them for SouperBowl, and make checks out to HSCPC
